
Dame Susan Devoy

INFORMATION STALL GROUPS

EPILEPSY NZ

"I'm really enjoying it. It's really busy which is good to see. This sort of event basically means we can get a presence in the community. People who have epilepsy or any other sort of condition have an avenue to contact people who may be able to help them, because this environment shows people what is actually in the community. Sometimes people who get lost in the health system don't know what to do and where to go for support."

Supported independent living for people with physical and intellectual disabilities

"We promote support for independent living for people with physical and intellectual disabilities so clients can stay independent in their communities for as long as possible. It's brilliant; there have been a lot of people, a lot of people helping out which has been amazing. These sorts of events allow families to see what's actually out there. I think a lot of families are isolated and without going out to these sorts of events and finding out what's out there, they don't actually know. It would be brilliant to have more of these going on for families. It's a way for families to be able to get together and meet other people as well. Honestly it's incredible, absolutely incredible to see so many people here on a Sunday, Father's Day as well, for being able to be here for people with disabilities!"

Whanau – Te Kotuku Ki Te Rangi - Maori Mental Health Organisation

"Look this is fabulous! To be honest this is the first time I've ever been to an event like this. The atmosphere here is amazing, this whole place here is pumping and the kids so well entertained, this is great!"

We do an array of services from residential support through to out in the community. I am here to promote particularly our Whanau Respite Care. Lot of people have come through, I'm nearly running out of resources, we're only part way through the day, people have shown great interest. It's given us a space, that's provided us to talk about our services as a whole. We get to be able to meet other likeminded organisations. All walks of life have been coming past here, because we're all interlinked somehow, so getting us all associated together in the one space has just been enormous!"

SPELD NZ- helps people with specific learning disabilities

"It's fantastic, the organisation has been over the moon, everyone's been so helpful. It's just lovely to see all the activities for the children as well as the parents, especially the teenagers and young people who have come out to help all the children with the different activities, it's just brilliant to see."

SPELD NZ helps people with specific learning disabilities It's been a great opportunity for us and we very grateful, really appreciate it. It's fabulous as so many of these agencies cross over, we don't just work in silos. We get a lot of families ringing us and asking for help, it's great for us to be able to know what other organisations are out in the community, so that, if they don't quite fit with our group, we know who to refer them to. For me, networking is another really important part of a day like this. I really appreciate the opportunity."

"This event is huge for public awareness! If a person doesn't know there's someone to help, how do they find it, because school systems are not very well known?"

"I love events like this because it's a great way of promoting, being together with people, communicating and getting everybody to share knowledge. This is what it's all about."

I wish to express my delight in finding something that was focused purely on providing fun for those children who often have to watch from the side-line due to their physical or mental disabilities. It was good to see an event that focused on a broad spectrum of children. I was impressed with the quality of games and entertainments that were provided during the event. I was particularly fascinated with the large blue. Part of me was drawn to the simplicity of these blue bricks, and observed a number of Dad's heavily involved with their children, the building of relationships. From the perspective of a parent, this event was engaging for parents and children of all disabilities. An opportunity for those in play, to be free to have fun, to be truly themselves.
